After 32 years of involvement in Haiti with Ventures In People Foundation Inc., Heidi Thomas has resigned from its Board of Directors. She, and her late husband Roland, were among the group of people who went to Haiti in 1981, saw the need, and were instrumental in laying the ground work for what we know today as the Ventures In People Foundation.

In those early days, health care was a primary need in the central plateau of Haiti and Heidi with her nursing degree was a "natural" and her "skills" were a plus.



Through the years Heidi has been a strong advocate for the Haitians and the work of the board, and has given countless presentations presenting the needs and programs based on the needs of the Haitians.. She has been successful in soliciting grants from service organizations for the board's work. She has been the leader of many work groups to Haiti often going more than once a year. If she found someone interested in Haiti, she would immediately organize a group and go South. There was no task that was too difficult for Heidi. She has seen the focus of the board's growth from a sole concern to an organization that today includes 4-H Clubs, a Goat Project, and Education Project and a Clean Water Project.

The board is grateful for her many years of service. In recognition of that service she preferred that in lieu of a celebration to honor her work, a monetary gift be given to the work of 4-H in Haiti.. The board has honored that request and is inviting all who know her to join the board in honoring her with a congratulatory note and/or a financial contribution. 

Meet the Sarrizan 4-H Clubs

*As part of a new series, you'll have a chance to meet one of our 4-H clubs in each issue. You'll learn about the history of the club, projects they're involved in, and other interesting facts. In this issue, we take you to one of the original 4-H clubs: Sarrizan!



Sarrizan is where it all began! In 1996, members of Ventures in People first shared the concept of 4-H with members of the community in Mirebalais. The idea was well-received, and two clubs were formed; Sarrizan being one of them.

Since then, membership has grown tremendously! What started as a club of 20, now boasts over 350 members and 18 volunteer leaders between two clubs. Some leaders have been with the club since the beginning! Club members are active in raising goats, gardening, sewing, Haitian dance, and crocheting.

Sarrizan 1 and 2 have played an important role in their community too. A number of years ago, they used their grant money to tap a mountain spring and build a water fountain that supplied the community with clean water for drinking, laundry, and bathing. In addition, they've built a community latrine, as well as shared their garden produce with those in need. Not only that, but Sarrizan goes above and beyond the grants they receive from VIP, and supports their club by selling goats and produce at the local market.

One of my most profound moments from all the work I've done with VIP came last summer on a visit to the Sarrizan clubs. Rain was pouring down, but that didn't stop the hundreds of eager 4-H members who squeezed into an open-air shelter and welcomed us in song. As we talked with them, they asked us what 4-H clubs in the United States do to help the parents of members. We racked our brains and started to answer their question, but soon learned that they really didn't need to hear our advice- they had already taken action. Just then, a group of about 30 women in the crowd stood up and sang a special song they had prepared. But these weren't just any parents. These were parents who had recently learned to read and write for the very first time, all thanks to a night school that the 4-H club had started! The club had seen a need for literacy and had taken action. Seeing the joy and accomplishment in the faces of these women went beyond words! It is something I will never forget. What this 4-H club did to help their community was truly inspiring and a real example of how 4-H clubs are changing lives in Haiti!

The Sarrizan 4-H clubs continue to be assets to the youth they serve, and their efforts have improved the way of life for everyone in the community!

We are excited to report to you that for this coming school year Louis Tenior Guerrier, our education coordinator in Mirebalais, Haiti, has added another school in which our VIP program has enrolled students. The name of the school is Ecole Mixte Evangelique du Progres (quite a long name). So we now have ten schools in our program for the 2013-14 school year. At this time we can't give you a definite number of students enrolled, because we are still in the process of arranging class lists and assigning students to new sponsors.

NEW TEACHER AND PEN PALS

When Louis was in Wisconsin this past spring and the one previous he visited with the children and adults at First Congregational

Church in Sheboygan, WI. As a result of the relationships that were established, the offerings from their church school this year are going to fund the salary for one of our English teacher's this year. Along with that they are establishing pen

pals with four of the students in our program. We are looking forward to working with them in this new venture and are indeed grateful that they have chosen, as their mission, finding ways to improve education in Haiti. In our next newsletter we will be able to share more of the story along with pictures.
